### January/February

- Four schools honoured by High Wycombe Cl 422 for their part in the Nativity Scene Painting competition and the National Prayer competition.

- Full Knighthood & Deceased Brothers Mass held at The Most Sacred Heart, Ruislip commencing at 6.00 pm.
- Hayes Cl 243 announced that they had been able to donate £500.00 each to Macmillan Nurses and Hayes Friends of the Homeless Group as a result of the Sponsored Walk held in 2018.
- The Ealing Centre for Independent Living (ECIL), the Provincial Project for 2018, was presented with a cheque for £2,974.25

- The annual pilgrimage to Aylesford took place on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> June supported by a coach of pilgrims from Hanwell Cl 163 with other brothers and their families in attendance.
- An important day for the brothers of Uxbridge CI 399 when on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> April during the 9.00am Mass at St Bernadette's, Long Lane, Hillingdon three new brothers were received into the Order and the officers of their Council were installed for the coming year

The Life of John Ryan RIP 16<sup>th</sup> September 1953 – 9<sup>th</sup> November 2019 A member of Hanwell Council 163 (This eulogy was narrated by Bro John Collins following John's funeral Mass on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> November 2019.)

John was born to Mary and Jack Ryan on 16th September 1953 in Rathmore, Aughnacliffe, County Longford, Ireland. John lived in Longford, in his Grandmother's house, before moving to London when he was young. He did not stay static for long, travelling back and forth



between London, Ireland and even New York in the United States.

Early in John's working life he had a stint working for Aer Lingus, before then starting his Lufthansa journey, with humble beginnings in the mailroom of their Bond Street offices. John being John, he needed to keep himself busy, so he also began working part-time for the Metropolitan Police, taking Friday evening and weekend shifts.

At age 19, John met Geraldine and later married in St Aiden's Church in East Acton. On moving to Hanwell with Geraldine, his working life started to evolve. John moved roles with Lufthansa and began his life at Heathrow. He also gave up his role with the Police to take over the local Youth Club, right next door.

As the years flew by, John and Geraldine were blessed with 3 children. First their son Shannon, followed by their two daughters, Colleen and Roisin. As the family grew, so did the list of family holidays.

John always loved spending time with his family, and even though John's family is spread across the globe, he would try and travel around to see all of them. From driving house to house in Ireland, to flying across the Atlantic to the United States, John did his best to make sure the family stayed connected, usually joined by his wife and kids. John would sometimes gather close friends and work colleagues to enjoy the ride too, and some of those lucky ones might be in attendance here today.

In 2001, after many happy years with Lufthansa, and working himself up to the role of Lufthansa Training Manager, John decided to start RathmoreRyan Aviation, and become his own boss, as he knew best anyway. His passion and knowledge of the Dangerous Goods industry helped him become a leading figure within it, as well as gain him the trust of many industry colleagues and customers. The growth of RathmoreRyan had John travelling across the globe once again, and from that grew many more friendships.

Back home, his three kids were not the only ones John considered part of his immediate family. John would also come to include Tara Findlater (nee Pugh) (RIP) and Shane O'Connell, treating them both like his own. When Shane married in 2009 they gained a daughter-in-law in Priti, and were later blessed when John and Geraldine then became grandparents. First with Ryan in 2013 and then again with Yasmine in 2018. Later in 2018, John and Geraldine's family grew once again as they welcomed John Kane as Roisin's new husband, and their new son-in-law.

As many of you know, John loved his animals. Over the years John and Geraldine had many dogs, cats, fish, budgies, and even rabbits. These rabbits, Gizmo and Eevee, can still be found in the house, hopping around and chewing wires.

A few summers ago, John adopted not just a new dog, but also a new best friend, Brody. With the help of Aunt Sadie, who was visiting from New York, John went to Battersea Dogs and Cats Home, and brought Brody home. Brody kept John very busy, going for walks every day, and bringing John back into local pubs he had not frequented for years, where they both enjoyed a quiet drink. Brody with a fresh bowl of water and John with his trademark pint of Diet Coke, no ice.

While his family (and now Brody), along with Lufthansa, were big parts of John's life, one of his biggest passions was following the ups.... and many downs, of his beloved Tottenham Hotspur. After being taken to the home of Spurs, White Hart Lane, on one of his first trips to London, he suddenly and inexplicably fell in love with the Lilywhites. It became a family affair, as the whole family became club members and through the years Geraldine, Shannon, Colleen and Roisin all made trips to North London with John, before he eventually decided, along with Shannon and Tara, to commit to the season tickets. Over the past few years, John's health deteriorated which meant he struggled to keep up with his reputation of being the man who could be anywhere at any time - much to his own dismay. Even in the last few weeks he showed us all that though his body wasn't as strong, he could still swear at a doctor, or sing a little Spurs song, and tell us that he loved us all.

John will be greatly missed, but I don't think any of us will ever forget him.

May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, Rest in Peace. Amen.
