Many of our Brothers, especially those in their 70s and beyond, still feel hesitant about using Wi-Fi and modern 0technology. But in today's world, staying offline can mean missing out—on connection, convenience, and community.

More and more communication now happens online. Video calls, messaging, and even council updates are shared digitally. Without Wi-Fi, it's harder to stay in touch with family, friends, and fellow Knights. A simple Zoom call can bring loved ones—and fellow B rothers—right into your living room.

Council meeting attendance has dropped to around 40% of council brothers. across many areas. That's a concern, here are talks about having VIRTUAL COUNCILS NOW. But it's also an opportunity. Joining

meetings online means you can take part from home, even on cold, wet evenings. The more you Zoom in, the more confident you become. It's easier than it looks—and once you've done it a few times, you'll know all the little tricks.

Wi-Fi also opens the door to vital services. Booking GP appointments, ordering prescriptions, accessing news and financial updates—it's all quicker and easier online. And let's not forget the fun: streaming films, listening to music, reading e-books, or joining hobby groups. There's something for everyone.

Getting started doesn't have to be expensive or complicated. Many internet providers offer free routers and simple setup. You don't need super-fast speeds—basic broadband is enough. Most people already own a smartphone, tablet, or computer that can connect to Wi-Fi. And help is always nearby. Sons, daughters, grandchildren, neighbours—even fellow Knights—are often happy to lend a hand. Sometimes, all it takes is the courage to ask. Personally, I now book my doctor's appointments online, request repeat prescriptions, and have them delivered to my doorstep—all without leaving my chair. It's convenient, efficient, and empowering.

Wi-Fi isn't just about technology—it's about staying connected, informed, and involved. For the Knights of St Columba, it's a way to strengthen our unity and ensure every Brother has a voice. If you haven't yet taken the leap, now's the time. You're not alone—and you're more than capable.

**Getting Started Tips for Brothers - Ask for Help**: Family members, neighbours, or fellow Knights are often happy to guide you. **Use What You Have**: Smartphones, tablets, or laptops—most devices can connect to Wi-Fi. **Start Small**: Try joining one Zoom meeting or a brother to have an online face-to-face chat.... It serves to build your confidence up. Confidence grows quickly.

An Easy way-in .... Why don't you consider zooming in to one of the Rosary groups currently running.... You don't have to do anything but log-on. Also if you are housebound, unwell and don't feel like going out, why not ask your Grand Knight to set up a Zoom access. Councils are already using council-meeting participation on line and three councils stopped F2F council meetings, and now do it online each month. - IF THEY CAN DO IT - WHY NOT YOU?!!

#### **Promoting Training Across All Fronts.**

Since last Roundabout Province 41 has delivered an training workshop - Seminar to all the six **Provincial District Deputies** who will be visiting each council within the coming months, unless they have done so already. The workshop covered the basic standard that needs to be adopted on top of the standard visit report. Grand Knights are welcome to stay back after the meeting and chat the District Deputies - this helps from eating away your monthly meeting time.

A comprehensive induction course have been delivered for **nine new Grand Knights** who were taking office for their first year of three year rotation window. This was very well received and helps the Grand Knights understand the Basic Standards of running a council, knowing whats expected, helps their confidence and performance, and shows that taking office is not rocket science.

**Finance and Administration officers** have also availed themselves from a workshop that helps them to understand the importance of their office. One needs to have a basic knowledge of how to handle and report money matters , and the course helped in identifying the Basic requirements of the office—and more so the areas set down in the Constitution and Rules of the order about getting it done right.

Since last April Province 41 brothers have been made aware of the need for Rotation and that GKs and officers will who have served their terms will need to give other brothers a chance. In the coming months there will be **an opportunity for all brothers** who consider stepping forward, or are aspiring to do the GK job to join a workshop/Seminar to accustom themselves to the requirement of the job. Nothing is very difficult if you know what you need to do.

### New brothers.....





Honouring Our Long-Serving Brothers: A Call to Action.

Too often, we overlook the quiet dedication of those brothers who consistently give their time, energy, and heart to the work of their council. They're the ones who always step up — the dependable few who carry much of the load. And yet, there's a risk that we begin to take them for granted. "They always do it," one might say. "Why should I get involved?"

Well, it's time we changed that mindset.

Recognising long service is not just a nice gesture — it's a vital part of sustaining fraternity and showing appreciation. The Order provides two formal ways to honour this commitment:

The Jubilee Medal for 25 years service & The Gold Jubilarian Medal for 50 years service.

Responsibility for ensuring these awards are given doesn't fall to one person alone. The **Membership Officer** should be aware of who's due for recognition — but so should the **Grand Knight**, who ultimately carries the responsibility.

That's why the Good Standing Order list (GSO list) must be part of your working folder and reviewed regularly, especially around **March and April**, when new terms begin.

I'm encouraged that some councils have recently taken action — but others still haven't. At **Council 984**, we take pride in caring for our brothers. In recent weeks, we've made presentations of both the Jubilee and Gold Jubilarian medals:

**Brothers Robert March and Peter Reid**, who both joined 25 years ago, were honoured with their Jubilee medals during the **Edmund Campion relic tour** at St Joseph's church, in Bracknell. Unfortunately Bro Peter Reid was unwell and another opportunity will soon come.

**Brother John Lynn** received his Gold Jubilarian medal at the **open-air Mass at Lyford** — during the annual pilgrimage at the site where St Edmund Campion was captured, a fitting tribute to his half-century of service, and all the work in organising the annual pilgrimage.

These moments matter. They remind us of the strength and continuity of our brotherhood. Let's make sure every deserving brother receives the recognition he's earned across all our councils.

## Farewell to key brother

#### In Loving Memory of Brother Paul Porter (R.I.P.)

On Monday 16th June, the funeral of Brother Paul Porter was held at the parish church of The Most Precious Blood and St Edmund, Edmonton. The church was filled to capacity, a testament to the love and respect Paul inspired in his community. Nearly thirty Knights formed a moving guard of honour, reflecting his deep connection to Council 248 and the Order.

Paul passed away at the age of sixty-five, following a recent period of hospitalisation. His loss is deeply felt by all who knew him.

A Life of Service and Strength

Paul joined the Metropolitan Police in 1980, during the challenging period of the Broadwater Farm riots. His imposing stature and commanding voice were matched by a compassionate heart. He played a key role in mentoring young officers, especially in handling anti-social behaviour with firmness and empathy. After three decades of service, Paul retired in 2010.

Community, Family, and Faith

A passionate rugby enthusiast, Paul became a referee for local junior teams, bringing fairness and encouragement to the pitch. He married Carol in July 1986, and together they raised Matthew and Hannah, later becoming proud grandparents.

In retirement, Paul poured his energy into fundraising for St Edmund's Primary School, helping finance a school extension and the refurbishment of the parish centre. During the COVID pandemic, he lifted spirits by running community bingo sessions — earning the affectionate nickname "Bing Bong" — and was a regular presence at parish barbecues and quiz nights.

Paul was a steadfast supporter of both the parish priest and the Knights of St Columba, embodying the values of fraternity and service.

A Legacy That Lives On

Though Paul is no longer with us, his legacy continues. His family is committed to raising funds for new equipment at St Edmund's Primary School, and the school has honoured his memory by establishing the annual Paul Porter Prize, awarded to the best student — a fitting tribute to a man who gave so much.

On 15th June 2024 I was privileged to present Bro Paul Porter, Secretary at Co248 Edmonton with his Meritorious Medal for his continued hard work at his council.

Brother Paul will be deeply missed, but his spirit lives on in the community he helped build and the lives he touched.
